- 1.) The radio's that all the Disciplines are using are capable of having as many as 32 or more different conversations on each channel with out interfering with one another. So I have assigned the following channels. ***CHANNELS 1-7&15-22 ARE FOR FCC LIC. HOLDERS ONLY AND CAN RESULT IN A HUGE FINE IF WE ARE FOUND TO BE USING THEM!*****
- *Channel 8- Club RSO/Medical staff/Event Director- During events such as the youth field day if a person was to sprain something there is no need to be broadcasting it to EVERY event station and alarming anyone.

*Channel 9- Sporting Clays-

- *Channel 10-NRA Pistol- They rarely have a event that they need to use radios but so I dont leave them out.
- *Channel 11- Archery- Again they never use radio's but if we get a 3-D range going again they will need a channel.
- *Channel 12- IDPA- Bay #1 would be Channel 12 privacy channel 01 you can have use of 1-32 on most Motorola's

*Channel 13- Rifle

*Channel 14- Trap- Trap will be able to assign each trap field a number and not have every trap field hear all the radio chatter ie. Trap field #1 Channel 14 p.c.01
Trap field #2 Channel 14 pc 02 etc.

AGAIN ALL THE RADIOS OUT THERE ON THE MARKET HAVE WHAT THEY CALL "PRIVACY CHANNELS", THEY ARE BASICALLY A SUB CHANNEL WITH-IN A CHANNEL. SOME RADIO'S HAVE 22 OTHERS HAVE 32 AND MORE EXPENSIVE UNITS HAVE UP TO 48 PRIVACY CHANNELS. THIS ALLOWS EACH CHANNEL TO HAVE DOZENS OF CONVERSATIONS GOING ONE ALL AT THE SAME TIME WITH OUT INTERFERING WITH ONE ANOTHER.

THIS WILL MAKE COMMUNICATIONS DURING DAYS WITH MULTIPLE EVENTS WORRY FREE AND IT WILL ALLOW EACH Discipline TO TALK WITH EACH OTHER VIA THE RADIOS ON DAYS THAT THERE ARE MULTIPLE EVENTS TAKING PLACE.

**IF ANYONE IS UNSURE HOW TO USE THERE RADIOS AND THEY NO LONGER HAVE THE MANUALS I WILL BE MORE THEN WILLING TO HELP ANYONE FIGURE OUT THERE RADIO. TYPICALLY THEY MAKE IT VERY EASY TO SWAP THE "PRIVACY CHANNEL". This will streamline the communication of Disciplines on event days. If anyone needs further explanation contact me and we can meet.
