DIRECTIONS: The entrance to the club is at 79 Holmes Rd., Scarborough, ME 04074. From Maine Turnpike Exit 42, turn left at the first light (Payne Rd.) Turn left at the next light (Holmes Rd.). After approximately 1 mile, Beech Ridge Speedway will be on your left and a large parking lot on your right. The club entrance road is on the right, just beyond the parking lot.

RULES: NRA Pistol Rules apply to the State Championship, Distinguished Revolver Match, .22 Caliber Only 2700, and .22 Caliber Only Team Matches. CMP rules apply to the Excellence in Competition Matches. Competitors are expected to have a practical knowledge of the appropriate rulebooks, which are available for free at www.nrahq.org/compete and www.odcmp.com/Competitions.

COMPETITION OPEN TO: This tournament is open to all competitors. Individuals under the age of 18 <u>must</u> be accompanied by a parent or adult guardian. NRA membership is encouraged, but not required to compete.

ENTRIES: The Governor's virus restrictions on distancing are still in place so the maximum number of firing positions for this match will be 26, therefore, **pre**registration is **REQUIRED**. Please contact Stan Wojcoski, above, for registering. Lunch will not be provided so be sure to bring your own. Masks are optional, not required.

NOTE: All Team Matches are unfired ("paper") matches and will be the aggregate of the team members' scores in the individual NMC Matches from their respective 2700. Teams MUST register before the beginning of the individual matches.

FEES: - A package fee of \$40.00 includes the NRA registration fee (\$5.50) and all individual and aggregate matches for the Maine State Championship <u>or</u> the .22 Caliber Only 2700, and lunch.

- A package fee of \$30.00 includes the NRA registration fee (\$5.50) and all individual matches and the aggregate matches for <u>any two</u> "900's" in one 2700 and lunch.

- A package fee of \$20.00 includes the NRA registration fee (\$5.50) and all individual matches and the aggregate match for any one "900" and lunch.

A package fee of \$10.00 includes the NRA registration fee (\$5.50) and all individual and aggregate matches for either the Maine State Championship <u>or</u> the .22 Caliber Only 2700, **or** <u>any one or two 900's</u>, and lunch for any **Junior** competitor (as defined under NRA rules 2.3-2.3.2).

- EIC ("Leg") Match fee is \$15.00 per match, which covers the CMP fee.
- Team Matches fee is \$10 per team.
- Distinguished Revolver Match fee is \$5.

ENTRIES CLOSE: Entries close at 7:45 A.M. on the day of the tournament. Check-in opens at 7:00 A.M.

ENTRY LIMIT: Entries are limited to 26 competitors.

POST ENTRIES: Post entries will be accepted at the Match Director's discretion on the day of the event. Competitors whose first entry is one of the second "900s" may check-in until 9:00 A.M. Competitors whose first entry is one of the third "900s" may check-in until 11:00 A.M.

FIRING STARTS: Competitors will be called to the line at 8:00 A.M.

CLASSIFICATION OF COMPETITORS: Competitors officially classified by the NRA for outdoor pistol competition, or who have a temporary classification by Score Record Book or an "Assigned Classification" will compete in that classification. Competitors who do not hold a classification by any of these means will be assigned to the Master Class.

AWARDS: Maine State Outdoor Pistol Champion - Winner of Match #16.

Additional awards:

<u>Place awards</u> for the Winner in the respective grand aggregate of Match #32. Place award winners may not receive a class award but will be included among members of their class to determine the number of class awards.

Class awards in each class in each aggregate match as follows:

1st if 4 or more competitors, and 2nd if 8 or more competitors, and 3rd if 12 or more competitors, etc. When there are fewer than four competitors within a class they will be combined with other classes until a total of four or more individuals is obtained. However, the High Master Class and the Master Class will not be combined with other classes, regardless of the number of High Master or Master Class competitors.

<u>Special category awards</u> in Matches #16 and #32 in the following categories when there are four or more competitors: High Junior and High Woman.

Note: Awards for the NRA Distinguished Revolver Match and CMP Excellence in Competition Matches are as described in the respective NRA and CMP Rules.

Place, class, and category awards will be mailed to the awardees within 90 days.

MATCH CONDITIONS: Our facility has 52 covered firing points and fixed targets at 50-yards and turning targets at 25-yards. As appropriate, current NRA or CMP pistol rules apply for equipment and targets.

Targets will be scored on the target frames. Competitors will score the target to their left and place and repair their own targets*. The use of plug-type scoring gauges is restricted to use by range operating personnel. Competitors acting as scorers may use scoring overlays but may not insert any device into a bullet hole. Scorers and competitors must sign, and competitors must turn in their score card at the end of each match. Please bring a small clipboard for your score cards and a stapler for attaching target repair centers; please, no heavy duty ("ceiling tile") staplers. Score cards not turned in within 30 minutes of the completion of each caliber aggregate match and the EIC and DR matches will be entered as DNF.

Slow fire refires, if any, will be fired at the end of the respective "900".

A \$3.00 challenge fee will be charged for each scoring challenge. A challenge period shall apply after posting of preliminary bulletins. The challenge period ends one half-hour after all preliminary bulletins have been posted. At that time scores become official.

*Our facility is wheelchair accessible, and assistance is available for the disabled. Please advise us if you have any special need.

MATCH SCHEDULE: The Conventional (3-gun) and the .22 Caliber Only individual and team matches are scored and reported to NRA as separate tournaments. Competitors enter either the "Conventional" or the ".22 Caliber Only" tournament and shoot shoulder-to-shoulder with those competing in the other 2700. Per NRA Rule 22.7, there will be no National Records awarded or established for the .22 Caliber Only Aggregate. For additional information, refer to Section 22 of the current NRA Pistol Rules.

NOTE: All Team Matches are unfired ("paper") matches and will be the aggregate of the team members' scores in the individual NMC Matches from their respective 2700. Teams MUST register in advance of the individual matches. Courses of fire follow:

Note: CMP rule 7.1.2 for .22 Rimfire matches requires competitors to assume and maintain a ready position for timed and rapid-fire stages with the loaded pistol pointed down at a 45-degree angle until the targets appear (face). If the bench in front of the shooter is too high to allow a 45-degree angle ready position, the ready position is with the loaded pistol lowered as far as possible without contacting the bench (must not rest on the bench).

<u>NRA Distinguished Revolver Match</u> This competition is open to any competitor who participates in either the 3-gun or .22 Caliber Only match at this State Championship. This match may be conducted concurrently with Match #33 at the Match Director's discretion.

.22 Caliber, Center Fire, .45 Caliber Team Matches and .22 Caliber Only Team Matches All Team Matches are unfired ("paper") matches and will be the aggregate of the team members' scores in the individual NMC Matches from their respective 2700. Teams MUST register in advance of firing individual matches. Pickup teams ARE allowed, however, no one person may enter two different teams.
