Board Meeting

September 6, 2022

Meeting called to order 7:00

Roll Call – Board members present were Mike Kane, Lisa Glidden, Carl Jakowenko, Mike McCaffery, Heather Jaccoma, Carl Dick, Sue Hamilton, Ellen Stenson, Mark Sontz, Phil Hamilton, Bob Chandler, Charles Largay, Darrin Kirkpatrick, Roger Bovin, Dan Burgess, Don Leonard, Greg Berry.

Special report – No report.

Financial report – Lisa reports as of 8/31/22 – checking \$49,002, savings \$335,270, total \$384,272, less: dedicated fund \$137,340, less: club house restriction \$131,099, less: funds set aside for land \$11,449, cash available \$104,384, fixed costs \$147,682, expended year to date \$95,861, balance left to pay \$51,821, available disposable income \$36,563.

CRSO – Carl's back from vacation. He thanked everyone that helped in his absence. He reported skeet shot is landing on LE 3. Damage on utility ranges #1 and #5, ballistic sand has washed out and road by LE 100-yard range because of the recent storms. Carl to call Grondin for ballistic sand, 2 truck loads, 18 yards each under emergency repairs. Motion was made not to exceed \$1,000, seconded, unanimously accepted.

Membership - Heather reported no hardships, 1,128 active members in the database, 56 applicants, 18 first readings, 6 have sponsors, 24 awaiting interviews, 8 awaiting orientations. This is the largest number of applicants the club has had to date, and the number is growing.

Club House Update – On hold.

Skeet update – Darrin reported they are starting a Fall league with plenty of participants. Things are getting busier on the weekends.

Old Business –

1. Updating our bylaws for 501-3c – All board members – Update bylaws to be completed and voted on by the October board meeting to tentatively present to

the IRS. There is no November Board or General membership meeting allowing 30-day notice to be presented to the General membership. Then the General membership will vote at the December GM meeting to approve/reject the mission statement and bylaw changes. Mike made a motion to give Treasurer, Lisa Glidden, and Member Maureen Largay authorization to make corrections as recommended by legal counsel to make final changes to the application for 501-3c, was seconded, no discussion, unanimously approved.

2. Senior and Life memberships – Change to eliminate senior membership until you become a life member. This would entail being over 65 and have 10 years of continuous membership in the club. This would affect future members. Motion was made, seconded, would start next fiscal year, 2023, no new senior discount as of fiscal year 2023, would affect new members, was unanimously accepted.
3. Camera upgrade – Charlie reports cameras will be installed on the 18th or 19th depending on the weather. Charlie stated shot from skeet is landing in the pits at rifle. Will be addressed in December.

New Business –

1. 2023 elections committee – Hank Wheat has volunteered to be the chair of that committee. Motion was made, seconded, no discussion, unanimously approved.
2. Snowplow contract – Next month.
3. Buildings and Grounds – is getting weak, needs new blood.

The coaches dedicated hours of their own time teaching the finer points of Trap and Sporting clays shooting: Carl Breytenbach, Lee Harthorne, Al Mexcur, Steve Penick – our sporting clays specialist, Tom Samarrella, and Chris Wheeler. - **Archery** – No report.
- **B&G** – No report.
- **CRSO** – Carl reported utility range #2 is shut down because of washout. Utility #3 and #4 has some erosion. IDPA ranges 2 and 3 are shut down, ballistic sand is washed out. Members are moving forward of the firing line on utility ranger #3 and #4, 50 yard and 100 yard, they are not supposed to. No shooting after sunset, it is coming sooner in the Fall.
- **Community Relations** – Sue reports not much to report. Check out SAM (Sportsman's Alliance of Maine).
- **Competition Pistol** – Don reported they are doing well. Held a regional match last Saturday. League every Thursday, all are invited. One more match October 2nd, Gil Hebert, will be the last match of the season.

- **Firearms Safety and Training** – No report.

- **Hunter Safety** – Starting soon. If you are over sixteen years old you can do it online, under sixteen must do in classroom. Two class may start in October.
- **IDPA** – Paul explained they are competition designed for defensive and/or combat skills, they usually hold 1 match a month from April through November.
